RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION in support of the Bayou Bridge Pipeline Project and to urge the Louisiana Departments of Environmental Quality and Natural Resources to approve permits necessary for the construction.

WHEREAS, the Bayou Bridge Pipeline is a shovel-ready project, approximately \$750 million investment that will create an estimated 2,500 construction jobs; and

WHEREAS, the Bayou Bridge Pipeline is a 162-mile project capable of transporting up to 480,000 barrels per day of crude oil and will connect several regional refining hubs, namely Nederland, Texas, to the St. James terminal hub; and

WHEREAS, the Bayou Bridge Pipeline is working with local Louisiana contractors, material suppliers, small businesses and landowners to build the project, including production of all American-made pipeline by a Baton Rouge-based contractor; and

WHEREAS, the Bayou Bridge Pipeline is designed to meet or exceed all federal, state, and local rules and regulations for safety, construction, and operation; and

WHEREAS, the Bayou Bridge Pipeline, once in operation, will help provide additional fuels and lubricants for Louisiana and regional manufacturers, in addition to creating more reliable infrastructure for farmers who depend on fuels to produce and transport their goods.

NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE POLICE JURY OF CALCASIEU PARISH, LOUISIANA, in Regular Session convened on the 9<sup>th</sup> day of February, 2017, that it does hereby express its support of the Bayou Bridge Pipeline Project and for an expeditious approval of necessary permits for construction to commence.


